Here are low-cost effective ideas to consider:

- Provide a link on your website, Facebook or other social networking sites to the NRC website. The Nebraska Rescue Council will maintain the list of licensed organizations for the current year.

- Hold services that discuss the importance of caring for all creatures both large and small, and how it relates to scripture.
- Distribute NRC literature or brochures in order to promote pet adoptions. The current NRC brochure is always available on our website.
- Hold “Blessing of the Animals” ceremonies where followers are encouraged to bring their pets to an outdoor service.

- Provide a list of local pet rescue organizations in your “welcome wagon” packets or new home owners.
- Identify caregivers or temporary homes for pets to reside during times of emergency, military service, or other unforeseen circumstances to reduce pet surrenders.
- Provide veterinary or food assistance (including hay for horses) to those who may be facing financial burden.
- Start a pet food bank program to help your local animal shelters or community members needing assistance.
- Coordinate local transportation assistance to veterinary appointments since many public services prohibit transport of animals.
- Encourage volunteering with local animal shelters or organizations. Volunteering is great for individuals of all ages, and for groups too.
- Provide straw bales for outdoor animals that need to stay warm during the brutal Nebraska winters to low-income families.
